E- Quiz on Accounting Basics

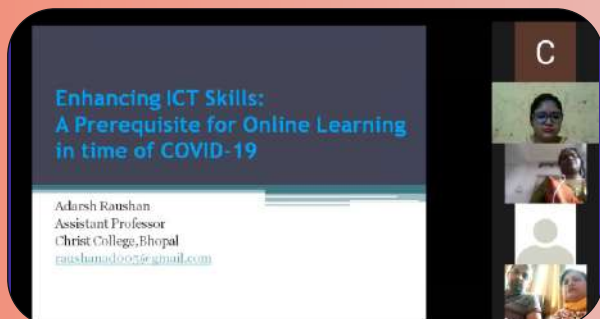

National Webinar Organized on Enhancing ICT Skills: A Prerequisite for Online Learning in the Time of Covid-19



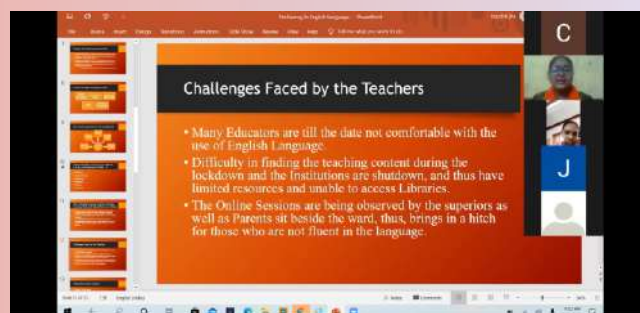

IGNOU Induction Meet

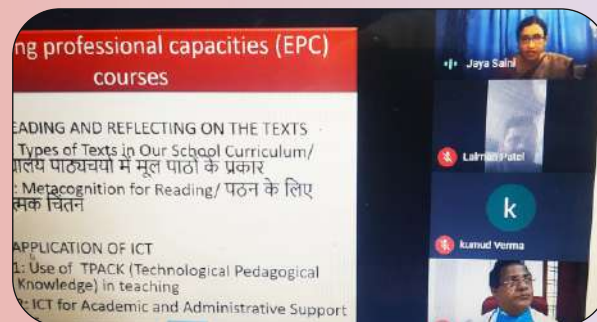

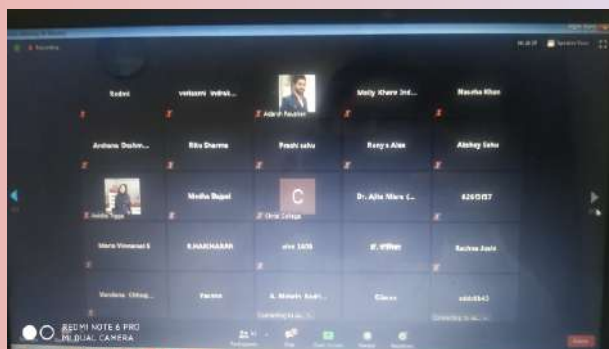


National Level Awareness Program on Animal Rights And Protection held on the occasion of World Nature Conservation Day
