



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Rabindranath Tagore, was a Bengali polymath who served as a poet, writer, playwright, composer, philosopher, social reformer and painter. He was born in the year 1861, in Calcutta, Bengal. His mother was Sarala Devi and father Maharsi Devendranath. He reshaped Bangali literature and music as well as Indian art with Contextual Modernism in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

In 1913 he became the first non-European to receive the Nobel Prize for Literature. Tagore was awarded the Nobel Prize because of his profoundly sensitive, fresh and beautiful verse, by which, with consummate skill, he has made his poetic thought, expressed in his own English words, a part of the literature of the West.

In 1901 Tagore founded an experimental school in rural West Bengal at 'Shantinikethan' (Abode of Peace), where he sought to blend the best in the Indian and Western traditions. Santiniketan embodies Rabindranath Tagore's vision of a place of learning that is unfettered by religious and regional barriers. From its very inception, Santiniketan was lovingly modelled by Tagore on the principles of humanism, internationalism and a sustainable environment.

Tagore, laid great stress and emphasis on the aesthetic development of the senses in his philosophy of education. He argued that development of the senses was as important as intellectual development. He therefore gave prominence to music, literature, art, dance, and drama in the daily life of the school. Tagore believed in an all-round development of personality and in his institution education continues to address the all-round development of the students. Tagore's theory of education is marked by naturalistic & aesthetic values. He had a belief that "The widest road leading to the solution of all our problems is education." Education can develop a new pattern of life which culminates in the realisation of Universal man. Tagore's system of education emphasises the intellectual, physical, social, moral economic and spiritual aspects of human life by which a man can develop an integrated personality

Tagore's ideas of non-authoritarian learning and goals for international education is best understood through his poem he writes:

“Where the mind is without fear and the head is held high,
where knowledge is free.
Where the world has not been broken up into fragments by narrow domestic walls.
Where words come out from the depth of truth,
where tireless striving stretches its arms toward perfection.
Where the clear stream of reason has not lost its way into the dreary desert sand of dead habit.
Where the mind is led forward by thee into ever widening thought and action.
In to that heaven of freedom, my father,

LET MY COUNTRY AWAKE!”

IGNOU 36th Convocation 2023

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) conducted its 36th convocation ceremony on 3 April 2023. President of India Mrs Droupadi Murmu awarded meritorious students at the event. IGNOU university conferred a total of 2,79,917 degrees, diplomas, and certificates to successful students in their respective programmes. IGNOU University is well-known for offering various programs in the distance mode. The proposed degree programs are available at UG, PG, and Ph.D. levels. On the other hand, IGNOU also provides non-degree programs as Diploma, PG Diploma, PG and Advance Diploma, PG and Advance Certificate, and Certificate. Besides this, admission to the IGNOU Distance Course is made online. The convocation ceremony took place at 36 Regional Centres along with the headquarters of IGNOU. The Program was telecast through digital mode at 36 selected Regional Centers across the country. The programme was streamed live on GyanDarshan, Swayam Prabha, Doordarshan, webcast through IGNOU Web Site and through social media platforms of the University. At this function the degree was conferred to the PhD and PG IGNOU learners. Smt. Droupadi Murmu, Honourable President of India was the Chief Guest and Shri. Dharmendra Pradhan, Honourable Minister for Education, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India was the Guest of Honour at IGNOU HQ, New Delhi. It is our honor to be a part of the ceremony and witness the program live from Bhopal. Dr Pallavi Shrivastava Sinha, Associate Professor was the master of the ceremony as she got an opportunity to anchor the entire convocation ceremony at Bhopal Regional Office. Christ College Bhopal has been a study centre for B.Ed. program of IGNOU and hence has a very long association with the same. It was an honour to be a part of the 36th convocation ceremony. Director, Rev. Fr. Dominic, Principal, Rev. Dr. Johnson and all teaching and non teaching faculty of christ college attended the convocation and extended support all though the program.


“The highest education is that which does not merely give us information but makes our life in harmony with all existence.” – Rabindranath Tagore.

A poet, musicians, writer and a painter, Rabindranath Tagore was one of the greatest minds of India. The first Asian to win a Nobel Prize, Tagore composed more than 2,000 songs and penned a large number of poems, stories, dramas, and novels. His works “Gitanjali” and “Jeevan Smriti” are still cherished today. Also known as “Gurudev” and the “Bard of Bengal”, Tagore came from a notable Brahmo family and played a major role in introducing Indian literature to the world. Let's have a look at some of the lesser known facts about him.

1. First Non-European to Win a Nobel Literature Prize - Rabindranath Tagore wasn't just the first Asian to win a Nobel prize, but also the first Non-European to mark his prominence in literature.
2. Tagore Inspired 3 National Anthems- Many people are aware that Tagore wrote 2 national anthems. “Jana Gana Mana” for India and “Amar Sonar Bangla” for Bangladesh. What many people don't know is that he also inspired the Sri Lankan national anthem “Sri Lanka Matha”. Some even hold a view that Tagore composed the anthem in its entirety.
3. Tagore founded Viswa Bharati- With the money that Tagore received with his Nobel Prize, he founded an educational space in Shantiniketan called Visva-Bharati university in 1918. It was an alternative learning space from typical classroom schooling where students could learn amid nature.
4. Conversation with Einstein -Tagore was once invited by Albert Einstein at his home. The two talked about religion and science and their chat has been documented in the “Note on the Nature of Reality”.
5. Tagore was knighted - King George V of England knighted Rabindranath Tagore in 1915 for his great contribution in the field of literature. However, following the tragic massacre at Jallianwala Bagh in 1919, he renounced his title.
6. Title of Mahatma- Rabindranath Tagore was the first one to give the title of Mahatma to Gandhiji.
7. Geetanjali - The preface of Tagore's most acclaimed work, Gitanjali, was written by another greatest poet of the 20th century, W.B. Yeats.
8. There are 3 Tagore museums in India and 5 in Bangladesh. The ones in India are: Rabindra Bharati Museum, at Jorasanko Thakur Bari which is his ancestral home in Kolkata. Rabindra Bhavan Museum, in Santiniketan, which is now a university town with the Visva-Bharati University. Rabindra Museum, in Mungpoo, near Kalimpong.

Important Days in May 2023
