emphasizes that while everyone is prone to errors, extending forgiveness to others is a higher virtue, reflecting divine mercy and compassion.

Forgiveness may seem easy until we have been deeply wounded and offended by a close friend. The closer the friend and the greater the offense, the more difficult it is to forgive.

Forgiveness is an act of love because it requires us to pursue after those who are actively running away from us. It is the opposite of revenge. It is the opposite of retribution. Do not take revenge: do not retaliate, pay back or take any form of vengeance against the offender. Reconcile with the offender: make every effort to restore the previous relationship destroyed by the offence. Do good to the offender: demonstrate kindness towards the offender'.


Faculty Development Program at Maria Vidya Sadan School, Bareli (Raisen, M.P.) Date: 26 June 2025

The birthday of Dr. Pallavi Shrivastava Sinha was joyfully celebrated on 25 June 2025. The occasion


