1. History of Father's Day

The idea of Father's Day can be traced back to 1910. It is believed that Mrs. Sanora Smart Dodd is the brain behind this day. Sanora, along with her five siblings were brought up by his father after their mother died in childbirth. His father neither remarried nor placed his children under the care of others.

Because of this, Dodd was grateful to his father, William Jackson Smart-a civil war veteran, and he wanted to honor him.

2. Washington was the first state to celebrate Father's Day.

3. Officially, the first Father's Day celebration took place on June 19, 1910.

4. Rose is the official flower of the Father's Day celebration.

5. In Thailand they always celebrate Father's Day on Thailand's King Bhumibol's birthday.

6. A tie is the most commonly purchased item of clothing for a Father's Day gift, but the third most common gift behind electronic gadgets and a day or meal out. After that, gift cards are the next most popular gift for dads on Father's Day.

7. US President Calvin Coolidge was the first to promote the idea of Father's Day in 1924. US President Lyndon Johnson signed a proclamation in 1966 declaring that the third Sunday of June should be designated Father's Day while President Richard Nixon signed a law to allow for permanent recognition of Father's Day in 1972.
