PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

National Education Day is an annual observance in India to commemorate the birth anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the first education minister of independent India. Maulana Abul Kalam Muhiyuddin Ahmed (11 November 1888–22 February 1958) was one of the foremost leaders of the Indian freedom struggle. He was also a great scholar and poet. He promoted primary and secondary education, scientific education, research



and higher studies. Azad strongly advocated for women's education. He was awarded India's highest civilian honour, the Bharat Ratna, in 1992.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development sets a different theme for National Education Day every year. The theme of the National Education Day 2023 is **"to invest in people, prioritize education".** UN Secretary-General António Guterres' in his message for the International Day of Education, reminted that 'Education is a fundamental human right. It's the bedrock of societies, economies and every person's potential. But, without adequate investment, this potential will wither on the vine. Investment is critical to achieving Sustainable Development Goal'. Quality education is the most important investment countries can make for their future and their people.

National Education Day is celebrated in schools annually by spreading awareness about the importance of education. This is done by conducting interesting seminars, activities, working on projects, writing essays and more.

When we will celebrate National Education Day, we have to keep in mind that India's total literacy rate is 77.70% (2021 and 2022). Quality education also plays a vital role in the growth of the social-economical standards of the country. This notable shift also highlights an increase in female literacy over the years. The Constitution of India recognizes the importance of education for all. Economic disparities, gender discrimination, caste discrimination, and technological barriers lead to illiteracy in India. Human Resource Ministry has initiated different policies like Inclusive Education, Increased investment in government schools, Vocational Training, Teacher training, changing social norms etc to achieve 100% literacy. All educators and educational institution have responsibility to contribute our time and knowledge to achieve common goal.

Consultancy Services provided by Christ College Faculty to Chavara Vidyapeth Kheri, Narsinghpur, M.P.

Christ College Bhopal was invited by Chavara Vidyapeth, Kheri, Narsinghpur on 9 October 2023 to offer an orientation to the teaching staff of Chavara Vidhyapeeth on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, National Curriculum Framework (NCF) 2023, and the CBSE School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework (SQAAF). Mrs. Rony Joy played a crucial role in clearing the doubts and queries of participants related to documentation for the CBSE School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework (SQAAF).
